- 9. What if I go into labor too early?
- 10. What if I haven't had my baby by my due date?
- 11. What happens if something goes wrong during my labor and I have to go to the hospital?
- 12. If I have to go to the hospital in labor will you stay with me?
- 13. How long have you been licensed as a midwife in Florida?
- 14. How do I find a pediatrician who will support my decision to have a home birth?
- 15. What is the difference between a midwife and a doula?
- 16. What if my baby is born with the cord around his neck?
- 17. Can my partner assist in catching the baby?
- 18. Do I need a doula if I'm using a midwife?
- 19. If my husband is going to be with me in labor why do I need a doula?
- 20. Is water birth safe?
- 21. Can I take photographs and video during the birth?
- 22. Will my health insurance cover a home birth? Medicaid?
